Our speaker this evening is Dawn Hooker, Director of Fundraising and Grants with Boysville. Boysville Children's Home and Shelter, the Home with a Heart, was founded in 1943 as a result of Rev. Don Holiman's observation of orphaned, homeless and abandoned boys sleeping in San Antonio's Travis Park. Today, Boysville provides a continuum of trauma-informed services and care for children and caregivers affected by abuse, neglect, and family crisis. Through holistic wrap-around services, Boysville provides each child the opportunity to heal from past trauma while focusing on their future.



Dawn is a graduate of Memphis State University. She has her degree in Journalism and a minor in Communications. She comes with years of experience in Business Development, Sales, Marketing, Communications, Philanthropy and Team Management. Dawn brings her business experience and her passion to make a difference in her community and the lives of others.

Her passion for giving started early in her career with the Dyslexia Foundation of Tennessee, Special Olympics, WHO Foundation (Women Helping Others), Gratitude International Foundation, and the Texas PTA, earning lifetime member recognition.

Dawn has been married for 27 years to her husband Todd Hooker, a native of San Antonio. They have two sons, Blake and Harrison. Dawn has dedicated herself to being very involved in her family's life. Her hobbies include volunteering, spending time with family, and travel.

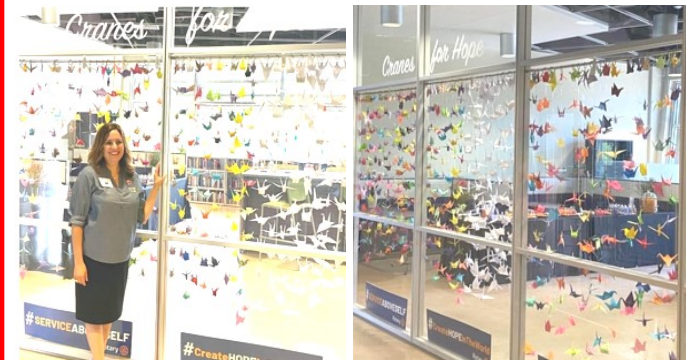

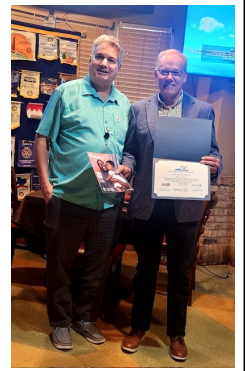
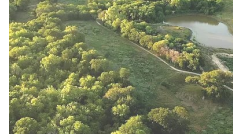


Memorial Day will be on Monday, May 27th. Please take a moment to remember and honor the United States military personnel that made the ultimate sacrifice serving their country.

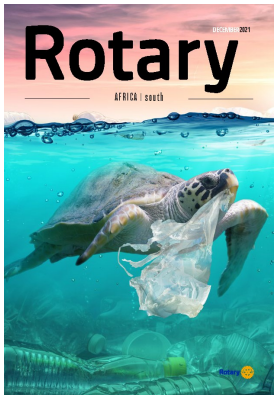
