We were pleased to welcome Colleen Swain, Director of the World Heritage Office in San Antonio, as our guest speaker last week. The office was established to promote the San Antonio Missions, the first and only World Heritage site in Texas, through the implementation of a work plan developed with community input. The work plan was created to maximize the socio-economic benefits of the designation while



balancing the needs of both the visitor and resident. Additionally, the office manages the historic Mission Marquee Plaza, a former 1940's Mission Drive-in Theatre, that today provides free cultural programming to the community, the Spanish Governor's Palace, a National Historic Landmark constructed in the early 18th century and restored in the 1930s, and the newly opened World Heritage Center.



We did not find out until the time of our meeting that Colleen is a member of the San Antonio Pearl Rotary Club. Joining us for our meeting was San Antonio Pearl Rotary Club's President Raven Mirabeau. Raven's ticket was also drawn for our weekly raffle, but he did not pull the Joker.
