




As an added option, you may also choose to make a voluntary donation to the Paul Harris Fund when submitting your dues. The donation amount is entirely up to you.

# Thousands set to gather in Calgary for Rotary's international convention, one of the 'Blue Sky City's' most multicultural events to date

Rotary members from 120 countries will be welcomed to Canada's third most diverse city for the second time since Calgary hosted the event in 1996. More than 15,000 Rotary members and participants from over 120 countries will gather in Calgary from June 21 to 25, 2025, for the



membership service organization's annual international convention. "I am thrilled to welcome my fellow Rotary members from around the world to Calgary and Alberta," said Alberta Premier, Danielle Smith. "As changemakers who recognize the needs of their communities and then take action to address them, Rotary members are fostering positive and lasting impact — and much needed inspiration at this moment in time."

As the largest event yet to be held at the newly expanded BMO Centre, the convention is expected to account for more than 30,000 hotel room nights, inject \$81 million CAD to the local economy, and drive significant business for Calgary's hotels, restaurants, retailers, and tourism attractions.
