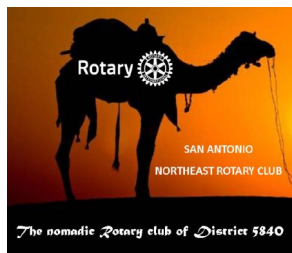
The model of care includes the following domains: physical, psychological, social, and spiritual. This approach improves outcomes as it addresses the patient's and their family's needs. CRIT's frequent multidisciplinary team conferences and collaboration amongst all members, set this center apart from other clinics, leading to improved functional outcomes.

In 2012, the TeletónUSA Foundation began raising funds for the construction and operation of CRIT, which autonomously opened its doors as a not-for-profit U.S. organization in San Antonio, Texas in 2014. As of 2021, CRIT has served 4,267 persons from all over the United States.

Honorary club member Mayra Rivero and her husband Antonio will be celebrating their wedding anniversary on August 9th. Congratulations.

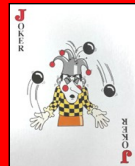
