






eradication of polio. Join us for Pints for Polio, a fun community night where every pint helps Rotary's global effort to



Larry Lunsford Named President-Nominee for 2027-2028

Larry A. Lunsford, member of the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza, Mo., was today confirmed as president-nominee of Rotary International – the association of the membership service organization's 45,000 clubs worldwide – and will begin his

Lunsford, a member of Rotary since 1991, is committed to inspiring Rotary's 1.2 million members across continents and cultures to deliver real, long-term solutions to the world's most persistent issues, while building professional and leadership skills through meaningful connections.

Lunsford will also oversee Rotary's top goal of ending polio. Alongside its Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners, Rotary has achieved a 99.9 percent reduction in polio cases, and contributed more than US\$2.9 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect more than 3 billion children from this paralyzing disease.



Born and raised in Macon, Mo., Lunsford attended Truman State University in Kirksville, Mo., on an academic scholarship, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting. He first encountered Rotary when he received a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to spend the 1981-82 academic year at the University of Newcastle in Australia.


Each member will receive one book (10 tickets at \$10 each) to sell and raise funds for our Rotary Foundation Annual Fund.
