Through donations from club members, a contribution from Frost Bank, and popcorn sales, we raised \$470 of our \$500 goal for



She is the Director of a program called Deborah's House, an organization that provides a safe supportive transitional living environment for women in recovery. Ashley told us about her background with drug addiction in her past, but she has also have found a new way to live in the previous seven years where God has helped to make her a new person.

Today, Ashley lives her life in a manner that she will do whatever she can to help other women come out of

similar life situations that she also struggled with. Ashley provides recovery coaching services, life coaching, physical fitness advice, and whatever her clients might need to support their recovery. Ashley also has helped to open a women and children's home called Redeemer House that provides similar services to Deborah's House but for women with their children through an organization called ONEsource. Deborah loves the community here in San Antonio and the recovery community and she works her best to serve wherever she may be called.
